

Minutes of the Meeting of the Council Wednesday 15th November at 7.30 p.m. **Clifford Village Hall**

Crime Report 17/150

The PCSO reported that there had been no crimes in October. Cllr Fawcett reported that, a month or so ago, van wheels had been stolen from the Thompson Environment site on Clifford Moor Road

Cllr Fawcett declared an interest in 17/161.

17/152 Public Participation Session

A resident asked if the 20mph signs needed to be in force all the time. Leeds City Council have a policy that there should be speed limits around all schools. Cllr Blackmore reported that signage and other matters will be considered in the traffic management plan which is being drawn up as one of the community projects arising from the Neighbourhood Plan.

A resident thanked the Council for the support given in dealing with the issues arising from the Grove Road development but that there still seemed to be little action from Leeds City Council. Miller Homes still having very early deliveries.

A representative of Illuminating Investments, outlined the plans to re-develop the High Trees site. They propose to build a new nursery funded by 8 4/5 bedroom houses. It was noted that the Neighbourhood Plan prioritises smaller homes and that the buildings would close the strategic gap between Clifford & Boston Spa.

A resident was very concerned that it appeared that the Neighbourhood Plan had not been given due regard in recent planning decisions made by Leeds City Council. The Council agreed, see 17/158 (c).
