

Neighbourhood Watch Roles

Co-ordinators

- Act as the point of contact to share information with scheme members.
- Encourage members to share and implement crime prevention advice.
- Promote personal responsibility for community safety by encouraging members to improve home and personal security.
- Support the Police and other agencies to identify and solve local problems.
- Encourage reporting of suspicious incidents.

Members

- Help the Co-ordinator distribute information to the rest of the group as required.
- Keep an eye out for any suspicious behaviour in the area and notify the Co-ordinator (or Police in an emergency)
- Act on crime prevention advice given by the Co-ordinator.
- Support the community to reduce crime in your area.
- Keep an eye on your neighbours' homes when they are on holiday.

First introduced to West Yorkshire in 1985, Neighbourhood Watch has developed into the largest voluntary community safety partnership in the UK. It is an excellent example of communities working together with the Police to address local issues such as burglary, anti-social behaviour, vehicle crime, and other emerging threats such as cyber-crime.
