FLOWERS

[Please keep the container simple]

26. A vase of mixed herbaceous, non-woody, perennial garden flowers; 5 stems each different
27. A vase of mixed annuals; 5 stems, each different
28. 3 dahlias, each different

FLORAL ART

54. **Morello Cherry Bakewell Tart.**

Line a round deep, loose-based flan tin about 30cm across with sweet shortcrust pastry.; plain flour, icing sugar, butter, and egg. Chill the base for 30 mins. Put on a hot baking tray and bake blind for 12-15 mins at 190C / Gas 5. Reduce the temperature to 180C/ Gas 4 and continue cooking if not fully cooked. Let it cool. Make the filling using 2 eggs and 150 gms caster sugar whisking until the mixture is very pale and mousse like. Gently fold in 150 gms of ground almonds, 1 tbsp double cream and 2 tsp. almond liqueur. Spread 4 tbsp. of Morello cherry jam or preserve over the base of the pastry case and pour the almond mixture evenly on top. Scatter with a tbsp. of flaked almonds. Cook for approx. 40 mins until the filling is golden and just firm. Quickly brush with 2 tbsp. warmed, sieved apricot jam. The tart will sink slightly.

RULES 2019

Anyone can enter. You do not need to live in Clifford to make an entry.

Competition Entries; 50p for each individual entry.

Children and Teenagers up to 16; 20p each entry.

- Entry forms **AND** payment must be put in an envelope and put through the letterbox of either 24 Albion Street, 1 Mill Dam or 7, St Luke's Close by 6.00pm Monday 26th August.
- All entries must be made/grown by the exhibitor unless otherwise stated.
- No items previously exhibited at another show should be submitted.
- All entries must be taken to the village hall between 9am and 10.30 am on the day of the show. Judging will begin at 10.30 am.
- All exhibitors must provide their own plates and vases/containers etc. The committee will not be responsible for any breakages.
- All names on exhibits must be covered for judging purposes. We suggest plates, jars and containers have your name on the bottom and pictures/photos have names on the back and other items have a luggage type label attached.
- An exhibitor may enter as many individual categories as they wish **but only the top 5 placings will be counted for the overall achievement award.**
- First, second and third certificates will be awarded for all sections. Medals are awarded for 1st places in the children's and teenagers' classes.
 - Diggles First Fruits will award prizes and certificates for their sections.
 - Cups or shields are awarded for overall achievements in the various sections and a cup for the most points achieved overall.
- The judge's decisions will be final.
- Where there is only one entry in a class the judges will make a decision whether to award a certificate or not.
- The show committee is empowered to settle any dispute which may arise for which the rules do not provide.
- All entries are to be left in the village hall until 4.00pm when the hall will be cleared and exhibits can be collected. Any items not collected by 4.45pm will be dealt with as the committee decides.
- The Village Hall will be open to the public to view entries from 2.00 pm.
